GEXCEL - ACTIVITY REPORT 2017

1. Introduction

In 2017 GEXcel celebrated its 10 years anniversary with a celebratory event in September. The GEXcel International Collegium activities proceeded well in 2017 in all main arenas. GEXcel hosted over 20 visiting scholars and guest doctoral students during the year for different periods, from Asia, Australia, Europe and North America.

During 2017 GEXcel scholars published books and book chapters by international publishers (including Bloomsbury Academic, Cambridge Scholars Publishing, Palgrave Macmillan, Policy Press, Routledge, Springer International Publishing, Studentlitteratur), articles in Gender Studies and other international journals (including Nora: Nordic Journal of Feminist and Gender Research: Norma: The International Journal of Masculinity Studies; Masculinities: A Journal of Identity and Culture; International Journal of Cultural Policy; The Sociological Review: Journal of Political Power: Feminist Encounters: A Journal of Critical Studies in Culture and Politics; Angelaki: Journal of the Theoretical Humanities; Tidskrift för politisk filosofi; Gender and Education; Journal of Aging Studies; Scandinavian Sport Studies Forum; Journal for the Study of Race, Nation and Culture; Sport, Education, Society; Applied Mobilities; British Journal of Music Education; Fe Dergi: Feminist Eleştiri [Feminist Critique]; NOTA Newsletter [National Organisation for the Treatment of Abusers]; Časopis za kritiko znanosti, domišljijo in novo antropologijo [Journal of Critique of Science, Imagination and New Anthropology]; Gender, rovné přiležitotosti, výzkum [Gender and Research]; IZG-Research Series; Baltic Worlds.), as well as numerous research and policy reports.


Furthermore, the Swedish Gender Studies journal *Tidskrift för genusvetenskap*, the oldest and largest Nordic journal within Gender Studies, NORMA: the International Journal for Masculinity Studies, and the journal Somatechnics were edited/co-edited within GEXcel.

The book series Routledge Advances in Feminist Theory and Intersectionality continued to be co-edited within GEXcel.

Over thirty GEXcel research events were organised at partner universities, and in addition GEXcel scholars were involved in co-organising several international events or presenting as keynotes or invited presenters in a large number of international and national conferences and other scientific events, and involved in various expert tasks nationally and internationally. The social outreach activities were also lively, targeting various national and regional administrative bodies, NGOs and media. GEXcel partner units sent funding applications to all major Swedish, Nordic and European funders, and received a good amount of grants from them.

The International Research Association of Institutions of Advanced Gender Studies (RINGS) that was initiated by GEXcel expanded and at the end of 2017 had over 50 member institutions. RINGS continued to be co-chaired by GEXcel, and its annual conference and General Assembly in October 2017 were hosted by the University of Reykjavik in Iceland.
